

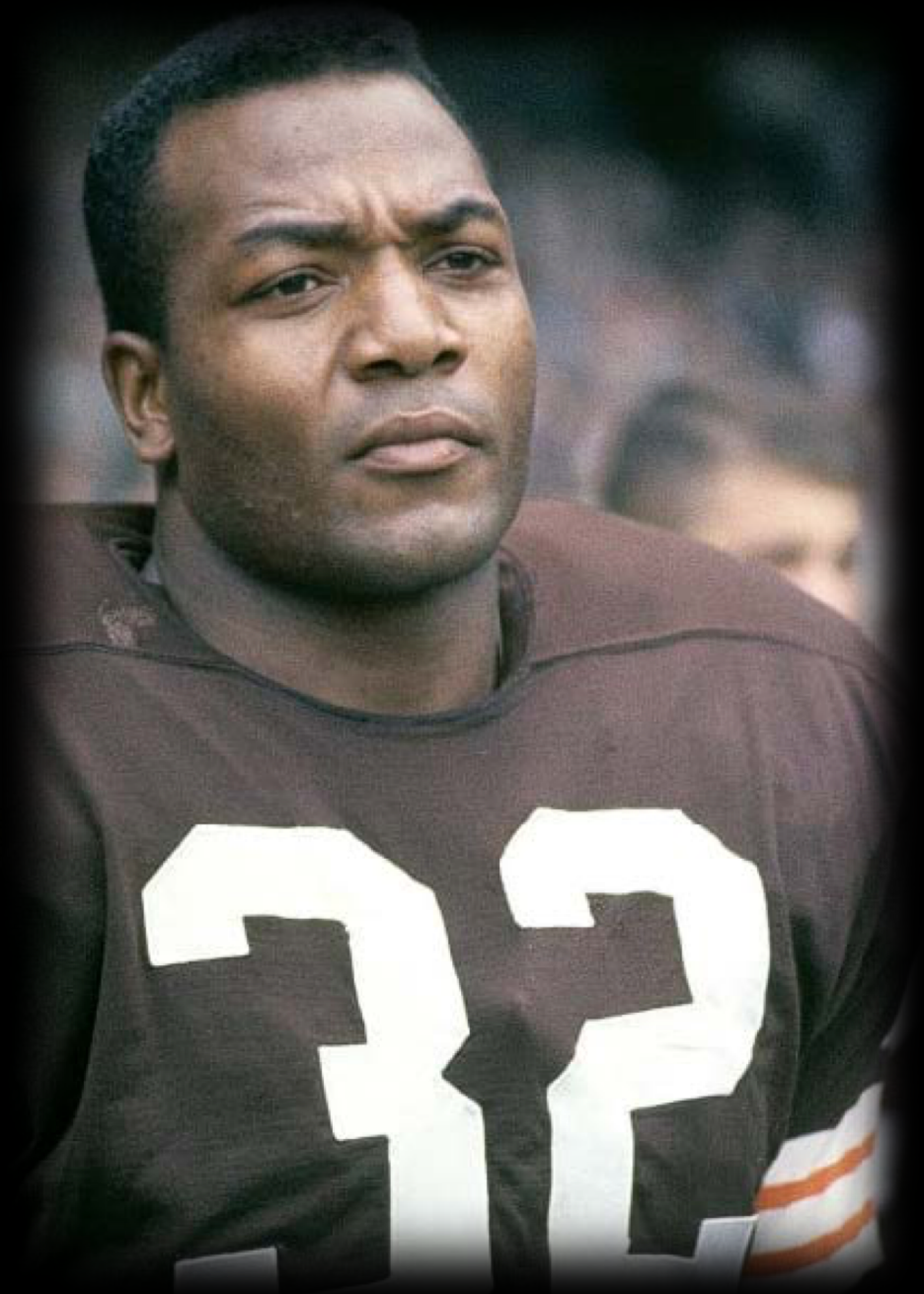

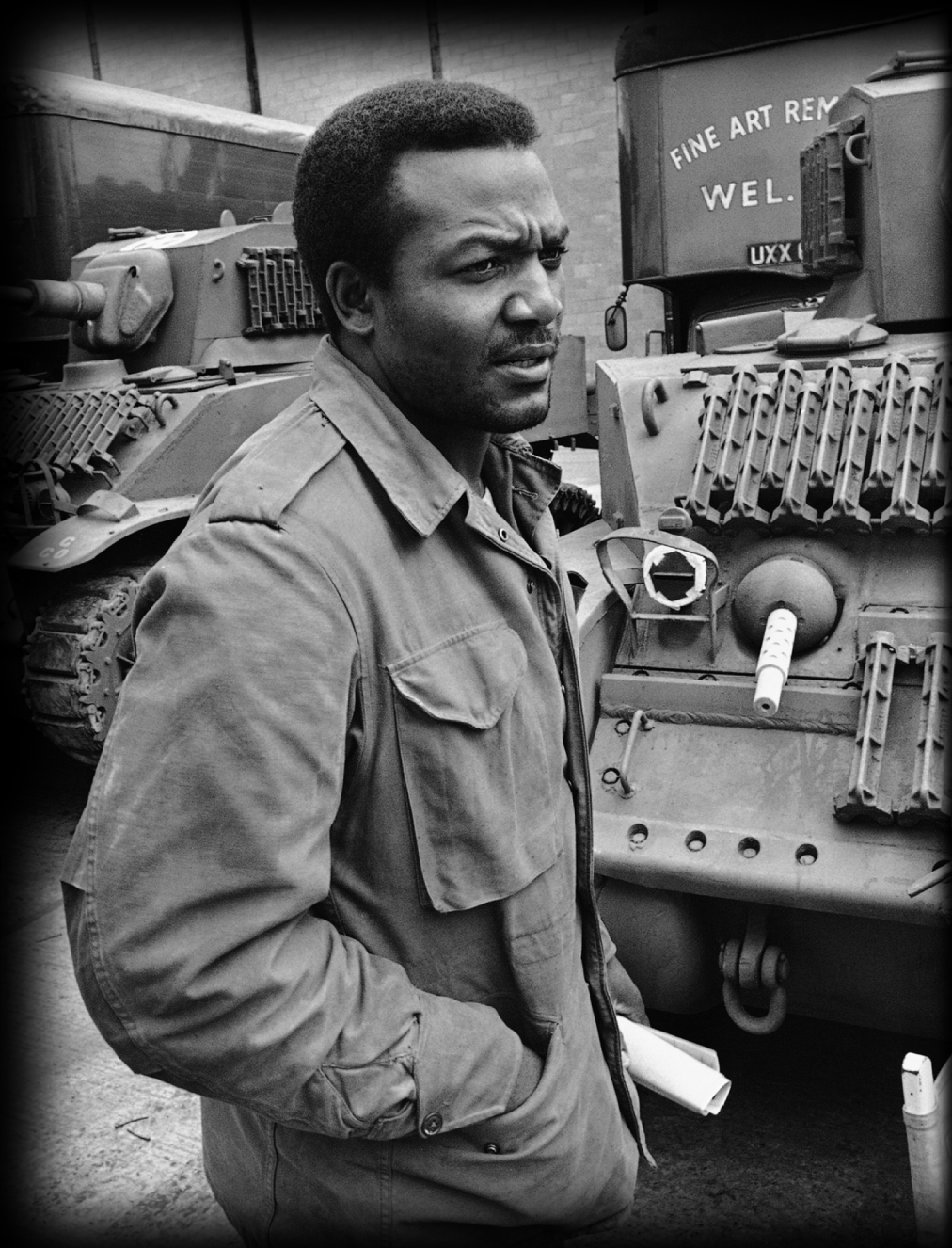

# ABOUT JIM BROWN

Jim Brown is widely regarded as one of the most historic running backs of all time. He earned 10 varsity letters in four sports at Syracuse University before being drafted to the Cleveland Browns in 1957. While in the NFL, Brown set multiple records and still holds the record for total seasons leading the NFL in all-purpose yards (five: 1958–1961, 1964). He is the only rusher in NFL history to average over 100 yards per game during a career. Jim was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2000, was included on the NFL 100 All-Time Team, and was slated #1 on ESPN's Top 150 College Football Players list.

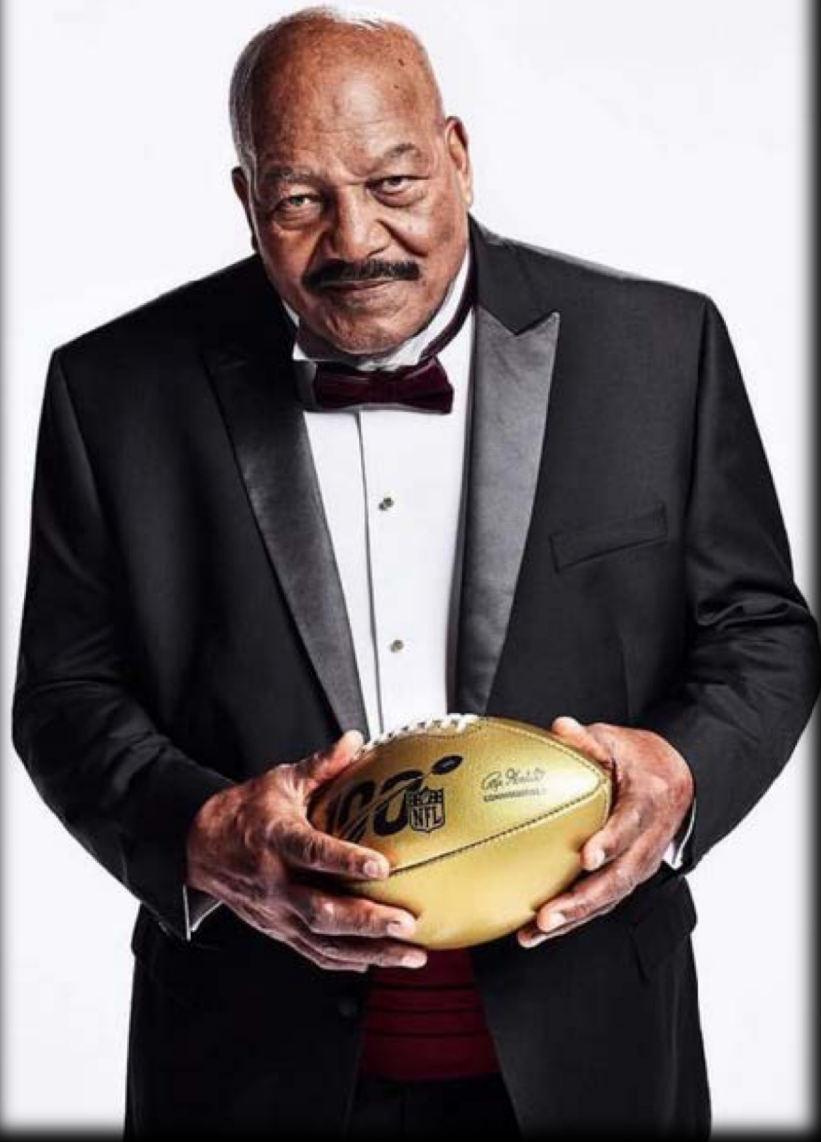




## FILMOGRAPHY

In 1993, he became a color commentator for the Ultimate Fighting Championship. He is part-owner of the New York Lizards of Major League Lacrosse. In 2013, Brown was named a special advisor to the Cleveland Browns. Following his retirement from the NFL, Brown pursued acting. His early roles include "Rio Conchos" (1964) and "The Dirty Dozen" (1967) before being named the leading man in films like "The Split" (1968), "Riot" (1969), "100 Rifles" (1969), "Kenner" (1969), "...tick...tick...tick..." (1970), "The Grasshopper" (1970), "El Condor" (1970), "Slaughter" (1972), "Black Gunn" (1972), "Slaughter's Big Rip-Off" (1973), "The Slams" (1973), "I Escaped from Devil's Island" (1973), "Three the Hard Way" (1974), "Take a Hard Ride" (1975), "Fingers" (1978), "Mars Attacks" (1976), "I'm Gonna Git You Sucka" (1998), "Any-Given Sunday" (1999), and "Sucker-Free City" (2004).
